## Governor Issues Executive Orders on Liability and Workers Compensation Coverage

Today, Governor Asa Hutchinson signed three executive orders regarding liability during the COVID-19 public health emergency. The <u>first order</u> grants businesses in Arkansas immunity from civil liability as a result of exposure from COVID-19, as long as the business complies with public health directives outlined.

The <u>second order</u> provides medical immunity to health care workers and providers, allowing them to use the crisis standards of care to treat COVID-19 patients, but does not extend immunity to willful, reckless, or intentional misconduct. This new executive order is similar to previous executive orders designed to limit liability of physicians and other health care providers.

The <u>third order</u> outlines that COVID-19 is considered an occupational disease under Workers Compensation coverage, but there must be a causal connection between employment and the disease.

All of the executive orders are extended through the duration of the public health emergency.

## Hydroxychloroquine Not Recommended for COVID-19 Treatment

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has announced the removal of Emergency Use Authorizations (EUA) for chloroquine (CQ) and hydroxychloroquine (HCQ) to treat COVID-19. The announcement follows the FDA's determination that CQ and HCQ are unlikely effective treatments for COVID-19.

In addition, the FDA further indicated the potential benefit does not outweigh the potential serious cardiovascular events and other adverse effects that can be caused by CQ and HCQ.2
