### **State Receives Rapid Antigen Tests**

This week, Gov Asa Hutchinson announced that Arkansas has received 100,000 new rapid results COVID-19 antigen tests from the White House. This shipment was from the 900,000 Abbott BinaxNow antigen tests allocated for Arkansas.

The governor outlined how the state will distribute the first round of tests:

- 55 percent will go to Arkansas schools to screen their staff weekly.
- 20 percent will go to the Department of Corrections for visitors and residents with public-facing jobs.
- 20 percent will go to the Department of Human Services for staff at the Arkadelphia, Booneville, Conway, Jonesboro and Southeast development centers
- The last 5 percent will be reserved for health care workers and "other populations" as needed.

The Department of Health has access to more rapid results tests through a different brand, Hutchinson said. And the state will receive 50,000 more Abbott BinaxNow tests each week.

Trump Administration Drives Telehealth Services in Medicaid and Medicare

On October 14, CMS expanded the list of telehealth services that Medicare Fee-for-Service will pay for during the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE). CMS is also providing additional support to state Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) agencies in their efforts to expand access to telehealth.

For the first time using a new expedited process, CMS added 11 new services to the Medicare telehealth services list since the publication of the May 1 COVID-19 Interim Final Rule with comment period (IFC). Medicare will begin paying eligible practitioners who furnish these newly added telehealth services effective immediately and for the duration of the PHE. These new telehealth services include certain neurostimulator analysis and programming services, and cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation services.

# Update from the Arkansas Center for Health Improvement: School District Data Update; Importance of Flu Vaccinations

Twenty-six Arkansas school districts have had 50 or more new known COVID-19 infections per 10,000 district residents over a 14-day period, up from 13 the week prior. "The doubling of the number of school districts in the red zone in one week is a cause for concern," says ACHI President and CEO Dr. Joe Thompson. "Most of the districts entering the red zone this week are in rural areas, which shows that COVID-19 is affecting all parts of the state." Rates of new known infections in school districts across the state, as well as counts of cumulative and new infections, are tracked on ACHI's COVID-19 in Arkansas web page.

In July, Arkansas Medicaid began <u>reimbursing healthcare providers for the administration of a flu vaccine</u>, a move that may provide a greater incentive to clinicians to offer the vaccine at a critical time. Getting a flu shot during the COVID-19 pandemic reduces one's chances of coming down with the flu and COVID-19 at the same time and helps hospitals avoid becoming overwhelmed treating patients for both illnesses.
