



## Arkansas Medical Society Call for Posters

The Arkansas Medical Society will host its **2026 Annual Meeting on April 11, 2026**, at the Little Rock Marriott. Highlights of this celebration will include the poster session and the inaugural gala and awards ceremony scheduled for the evening of April 11.

AMS represents the interests of approximately 15,000 Arkansas healthcare professionals, including physicians in practice and academics, physicians in training, and medical students. We estimate attendance by more than 500 healthcare professionals and guests.

**Saturday's poster session** aims to showcase ongoing research being conducted by AMS members -- both trainees and faculty/practicing physicians. The Society invites submissions for research/quality improvement projects conducted during the past two years in broad areas of inquiry. We encourage submissions from medical students and physician trainees.

There will be three poster categories:

1. Medical Students (only first author must be from this category).
2. Residents and Fellows (only first author must be from this category).
3. Faculty/practicing providers (only first author must be from this category).

**Abstract Guidelines:**

- ✓ Abstracts must be organized into the following sections: Background, Objectives, Methods, Results and Conclusions.
- ✓ Case reports may be submitted by members in training/ early investigators.
- ✓ Abstracts should include implications for research, policy, or practice in the Conclusions section, when applicable.
- ✓ Brand names of pharmaceuticals and trade names of medical devices cannot be used in the title or body of the abstract.
- ✓ Abstracts cannot contain illustrations, images or graphs. If an abstract is accepted, presenters may include these items in their on-site presentations.
- ✓ An abstract may contain one small table.
- ✓ The maximum word count is 250.
